## **Executive Summary**

#### District Strategic Plan 2025

Orange County Public Schools is the eighth-largest school district in the United States and the fourth largest in Florida. The district serves more than 206,000 students at 202 schools and is on of the largest employers in Central Florida with more than 25,000 team members.

Vision: To ensure every student has a promising and successful future.

**Mission:** With the support of families and the community, we create enriching and diversipathways to lead our students to success.

#### School Collection Development Plan

Andover ES serves 700 students enrolled in grades Kindergarten through fifth. The student population's ethnicity is 52% Hispanic and 48% Non-Hispanic students. Additionally, we serve a diverse population made up of 70% White, 19% Black, 0% Native, 7% Asian, 0% Pacific, and 3% Multicultural students.

The administration includes Principal Kevin Duncan and Assistant Principal Michael Glenn. Andover ES is proud to offer the many special programs which provide students with opportunities. These include: AR/STAR program, STEM, Chorus, Battle of the Books, Chess Club, and Girls Who Code Club.

A thorough analysis of the current media center collection at Andover ES indicates that the average age of the collection is 2003 and the number of books per student is 22. The <u>American Association for School Libraries</u> has established a criteria for highly effective media centers that includes a ratio of 15-20 books available per student in the collection.

At this time, Andover ES does meet the recommended standards for the number of books per student:

The analysis of the collection also revealed the following areas of strengths and concerns:

- Overall, our scores indicate there was an increase in ELA in every grade level on the state achievement tests thus we should continue to focus on purchasing more books.
- In addition to the physical media center collection, the district provides almost 5,000 eBooks, audiobooks and digital magazines.
- Our priority is the purchase of new books focusing on Hispanic students and Hispanic
- heritage and AR books for struggling readers.
- Based on the analysis, there is a need for more beginner books to purchase.
- Weeding will focus on the OCPS Catalog Project as well as aged titles in fiction and/or nonfiction.

#### Comparison between 2021-22 and 2022-23 Testing Data

In 2023, the state transitioned from Florida Standards Assessments (FSA) to Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) for English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics. The 2022-23 for FAST and Benchmarks for Excellent Student Thinking (B.E.S.T.) End-of-Course (EOC) assessments are based on provisional achievement level cuts that are linked to each assessment's respective 2021-22 reporting scale. Comparisons should not be made between the 2023 data and previous years' data. The implementation of FAST K-2 in the 2022-23 school year was the first administration of statewing assessments for students in grades K-2. These assessments include Star Early Literacy Proficiency, Star Reading Proficiency, and Star Math Proficiency.

## **Collection Analysis**

The collection is developed for and influenced by students, their interests, academic needs and alignment to the curriculum. The data below is a snapshot of the collection based on a Titlewise Analysis from July 2023, Purchasing or weeding after that time is not reflected in this data.
